		Abstract: Total Defence or known as Pertahanan Menyeluruh (HANRUH) is one of the core principles of Malaysia's National Defence White Paper (DWP) in pursuit of acquiring national resilience and comprehensive defence capacity. However, due to lack of awareness and promotion, has garnered less attention among Malaysian citizen as the fundamental basis outline in the principle that includes the civil preparedness approach is vital to deter unexpected war threats as well as to maintain sustainable peace and security in every aspect of national concern. This study employs a qualitative method through interview subject-matter expert on the field and analyses on sources such as books, journals, theses and websites. The study found effort and cooperation are very important in empowering everyone to involve in HANRUH implementation. All parties, including the public, among the civil preparedness in the HANRUH policy for the sake of country peace and prosperity. 		Abstract: This study is part of a larger research aimed at enhancing effective communication of parenting skills knowledge to Chinese parents. The purpose is to explore how to transform public service advertisements into effective training methods for Chinese parents by studying the media form, content expression, symbolic elements and other aspects of public service advertisements in China. This study documents the identification of effective communication characteristics of PSAs, in which advertisements in the form of cold and hot media have different sensory experience characteristics, their expressions of the central processing path, and the expression of the peripheral processing path of advertisements, which could be transformed to improve information transmission and are attractive to observers. The results found different characteristics in terms of language and nonverbal advertising content, which could create different effects on observers. This article mainly studies the different roles of different media forms, content expression, and symbolic elements in public service advertisements, as well as the communication effects of different forms of public service advertisements under different themes. The results have significant implications for developing a theoretical framework for the efficient dissemination of public service commercials and, consequently, for promoting happier families for developing children by improving parents' parenting knowledge.

Language Learning Strategies, the steps students take to improve their learning, are essential to ultimate Chinese as Foreign Language's achievement. The use of Language Learning Strategies determines student achievement. This study will examine the relationship between Language Learning Strategies and learners' achievement in Chinese as foreign language learning in Malaysia. This research uses quantitative research, a correlational study that applies the theory of Language Learning Strategies. 		Abstract: The Covid-19 pandemic was clashing Thailand while the citizens accused the government. In this crisis era, the main force of Thai youth protests has made street politics in Thailand different from the past. By problematizing this emerging phenomenon, this paper proposes two research questions. Why do the protests in Thailand during the Covid-19 pandemic differ from the past? How does the massive outbreak of protests generate implications in future Thailand? Therefore, this paper applied a qualitative methodology of the theory of Contentious Politics with the assistance of documentary analysis and questionnaires to conduct constructive research. Furthermore, this paper argues that the youth voluntarily organized the Thailand protests in recent years. However, the government used the pandemic control to restrict the protests while the conflicts with the protesters were being deepened, making it impossible to stop the protests. De facto, Thailand's social conflicts have existed for many years and cannot be solved in the short term. This paper recommends that the protesters put forward more practical agendas and appeals. Meanwhile, the government also should appropriately and proactively respond to the appeals. The multiple coordination and collaboration will be a channel to improve Thailand's domestic politics and democratic institutions.

		Abstract: This exploratory study was carried out to gather the essential components for developing a theoretical framework for measuring community awareness of disaster management. This is to provide an effective instrument for educating individuals, communities and organizations about awareness regarding disaster preparedness and prevention in order to conduct a more thorough investigation. This theoretical framework was developed using a combination of literature research, interviews, focus group discussions, and observation. The study found that demographic characteristics, knowledge of disaster, disaster experience, attitude and awareness of disaster mitigation, exposure to mitigation and preparation as well as preparedness to respond to disaster are the main elements of the independent variables of this conceptual framework. These elements will affect community's perceptions on managing disaster response, and thus affects individual, community and organization's mitigation and preparedness for disaster. A proposed conceptual model for measuring the level of awareness for mitigation and preparedness in disaster management is presented. This framework implies that in preparing for disaster, people of different social context may perceive disaster differently and may even affect disaster mitigation and preparedness contrarily.
